

Welcome to UMC. Please follow the instructions below to gather the information needed to complete your pre-employment health screening.

Please arrive 15 minutes prior to your appointment time with all of your completed forms and any other information listed below. You can also send the completed forms to <u>NewHireEMP@umcsn.com</u> or fax them to 702-765-7945, prior to your appointment.

1. Tuberculosis (TB) Screening requirements:

- Copies of all TB related tests completed *within the last 12 months,* including all skin tests and/or blood tests (such as Quantiferon or T-Spot)
- Proof of ANY past positive TB tests, regardless of date
- Chest x-rays, if applicable must have occurred AFTER testing positive for TB; cannot be dated prior to the past positive TB test
- Proof of treatment for latent or active TB

2. Fit Testing:

- If you are working with patients or will be going into areas with patients, you will require a fit test.
- $\circ~$ Please be sure you are cleanly shaven and have your hair pulled back.

3. Immunization requirements and documentation:

[** = *REQUIRED* for all employees at UMC]

- ****Varicella/chickenpox immunity, proof of:**
 - 2 doses of the chickenpox vaccine <u>or</u>
 - Positive blood test (IgG) showing immunity
- **Measles, mumps and rubella (MMR) immunity, proof of:
 - 2 doses of MMR vaccine, or
 - Positive blood test (IgG) showing immunity
- **Pertussis vaccine, proof of:
 - Tdap vaccine
- Hepatitis B vaccine, proof of:
 - 3-dose vaccination series, or
 - 2 dose series of HEPLISAV-B[®], or
 - Positive blood test showing immunity (hepatitis B surface antibody), or
 - History of positive disease (hepatitis B surface antigen)
- Influenza vaccine, proof of:
 - Current influenza vaccination (flu season is from August to May/June)
- COVID-19 vaccine, proof of:
 - Any COVID vaccinations obtained in the past

Tips on how to obtain your immunization records:

- Ask parents or other caregivers if they have records of your childhood immunizations.
- Check with previous employers (or the military, if applicable) who may have required immunizations.
- Check with your doctor or public health clinic.
- Consult your local immunization registry. Nevada's state registry is called Nevada Web IZ. The link to the public portal is: <u>https://izrecord.nv.gov/public/Application/PublicPortal</u>
- All states and some cities have centralized registries of vaccines given by local providers. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has a listing of registry contacts and websites here: <u>https://cdc.gov/vaccines/programs/iis/contacts-locate-records.html</u>
